EMBRACE TRANSFORM EQUIP IMPACT

Called General Conference of the United Methodist Church February 23rd-26th St. Louis, Missouri

The attention of Methodism will turn towards St. Louis later this month as our delegates convene for a highly anticipated Called General Conference. If you don't know much about what's coming, see the following overview from sgaumc.org/wayforward:

Since 1972, when the church set parameters in the Book of Discipline for ministry to, with, and by homosexual people, The United Methodist Church has struggled with this matter.

The 2016 General Conference took a major step toward trying to resolve the struggle when it approved a Commission on a Way Forward to be appointed by and make recommendations to the Council of Bishops. The Commission was charged with finding a way forward for our church that maximizes the presence of a United Methodist witness in as many places in the world as possible, that allows for as much contextual differentiation as possible, and that balances an approach to different theological understandings of human sexuality with a desire for as much unity as possible.

This month, a Called General Conference will consider legislation growing out of the Commission's work February 23rd-26th in St. Louis, Missouri.

I'm inviting all of us as members of White Bluff United Methodist Church to commit to praying for our denomination as it seeks a way forward. This Sunday you will receive a bulletin insert with guidance for prayer. We will also have special prayer on February 17th for the General Conference. As your pastor, I'll be glad to answer any questions that you might have during this time. You can email at pastor@wbumc.org or call the church office.




CONFIRMATION

Precious Lord, Take My Hand

Thomas Dorsey was a jazz musician from Atlanta. In 1926, he gave up writing secular music to concentrate exclusively on spiritual music.

In 1932, experiencing many of the problems common to many people living during the depression, he also faced the problem of having many people think his music too worldly--the "devil's music" they called it. Later he could laugh about it. He said, "I got kicked out of some of the best churches in the land." But the real kick in the teeth came one night in St. Louis when he received a telegram informing him that his pregnant wife had died suddenly.

Dorsey was so filled with grief that his faith was shaken to the roots, but instead of wallowing in self-pity, he turned to the discipline he knew best...music. In the midst of agony, he wrote the following lyrics: "Precious Lord, take my hand, lead me on, let me stand, I am tired, I am weak, I am worn. Through the storm, through the night, lead me on to the light; take my hand, precious Lord, lead me home."

We must remember that we do not need to be on the top of the mountain for God to use us in ministry, for many times our view from the valley also encourages those who travel with us.
