Someone Is Depending On You

Ron Hutchcraft writes about a young mother, trapped in the collapsed towers of the World Trade Center, who was under tons of debris for 27 hours. She said, "I took a piece of concrete and knocked on the stair above me. Voices came closer, and I put my hands through a little crack in the ceiling and I felt a person hold my hand." The fireman found my hand and he said, "I've got you." She was the last person pulled alive from the wreckage.

There's no scene more powerful than a rescue, whether it's a firefighter pulling someone out of tons of debris or a spiritual rescuer leading someone from an eternity without hope into the life only Jesus can give.

If you've been rescued by Jesus, the Bible says, "Snatch others from the fire and save them..." (Jude 23). It's your turn to rescue people within your reach who have not yet grabbed the hand of Jesus. Rescue is never easy. It involves taking risks and going beyond what's safe.

Pray for opportunities to explain to others how they can have a personal relationship with Jesus Christ. There's someone in your world whose life depends on you - like that trapped young woman depended on the firefighter who risked his life to save her. And there's no greater thrill, no greater joy than being able to reach out to a lost person and say, "I've got you," and to help them move from death to life.

Invite someone-invite everyone-to church with you this Sunday.
