CHICKENS

Jack London's wonderful classic, White Fang, tells the story of an animal, half dog – half wolf, as it lived in the wild and then learned to live among men. There is one story in particular from the novel that has left a lasting impression on my mind.

White Fang was fond of chickens and on one occasion raided the chicken roost and killed fifty white Leghorn hens. His master, Weeden Scott, whom White Fang saw as man-God and "loved with a single heart," scolded him and then took him into the chicken yard.

When White Fang saw his favorite food fluttering around him and under his very nose; he obeyed his natural impulse and lunged for a chicken. He was immediately checked by his master's voice. They stayed in the chicken yard for half an hour and every time White Fang made a move toward a chicken, his master's voice would stop him. Thus it was that White Fang learned what the master wanted – he had learned to ignore the chickens.

Weeden Scott's father shook his head when told about taking White Fang into the chicken yard. He said, "You can never cure a chicken-killer." But Weeden did not agree with his father. He challenged his father to a bet. He would lock White Fang in with the chickens all afternoon. For each chicken White Fang killed, Weeden would pay his father a one dollar gold coin. But if White Fang did not kill any chickens, then his father, Judge Scott, for every ten minutes of time White Fang spent in the yard, would have to say to him, "White Fang, you are smarter than I thought."

From hidden points of vantage the family watched the performance. Locked in the yard and there deserted by his master, White Fang lay down and went to sleep. Once he even got up and walked over to the trough for a drink of water. He calmly ignored the chickens. As far as he was concerned, the chickens did not exist. At four o'clock he took a running jump, landed on the roof of the chicken house, and leaped over the fence to the ground outside of the chicken yard and strolled to the house. He had learned the law of his master. And to the delight of Weeden and his family, Judge Scott got face to face with White Fang and slowly and solemnly said sixteen times, "White Fang, you are smarter than I thought."

Out of love and a desire to obey his master's will, White Fang overcame his natural, inborn desires. He may not have understood the reason, but he chose to bend his will to the master's.

Animal stories often have a way of breaking our heart or giving us great inspiration. Often these stories reveal a profound truth. The simplicity of White Fang's love and devotion to his master helped me to realize that I need to love and be devoted to my master, the Lord Jesus Christ. My life will always be full of "chickens." What I have to settle is, whom will I serve?


